Our aims

1. Delivering the PESSYP strategy.
2. Delivering the 3 hour offer.
3. Delivering the 5 hour offer
4. Delivering high quality Physical Education.

THE PESSYP STRATEGY

The national targets :

1. Ensuring there is a universal "5-hour offer" in place across the country. This includes access to 3 hours of P.E & school sport at school and 2 hours provided by the community
2. Ambitious expectations for take-up of the offer amongst 5- to 19-year-olds:
 - By 2010/11 40% taking part in 5 hours PE and sport per week
 - By 2012/13 60% taking part in 5 hours PE and sport per week
3. Ensuring the offer is accessible and attractive to all: by 2010/11, 80% of 5- to 16-year-olds will be taking part in 3 hours per week of PE and sport organised by schools. This is a floor target for all School Sport Partnership (SSP).

The main areas of the PESSYP strategy that we focus on to achieve the 5 hour offer include the following 10 strands.

1. Coaching - To offer a range of coaching opportunities for all cluster schools
2. Competition - To increase the numbers of young people accessing both intra and inter school opportunities.
3. Leadership - To give opportunities for young people to gain leadership qualifications.
4. School Club links - To promote out of school hours learning.
5. Swimming - to ensure all KS2 pupils can swim 25m
6. CPD - to provide up to date training for all persons involved in the Partnership.
7. Gifted & Talented - Identifying young people who could be the next Olympians.
8. Extending activities - Out of school hours activities which target beyond the traditional range of activities.
9. Disability - Ensuring all young people with disabilities can access the 5 hour offer.
10. Infrastructure - Embedding opportunities into all school curricula that provide ongoing sporting provision.

Sport Unlimited programme

The sport unlimited programme allows us to access funding to deliver a wider variety of activities to those young people not currently accessing 3 hours school sport.

Teacher support programme

Throughout the year we have a fully trained PE teacher going into schools to work alongside our Primary colleagues. This can be either to deliver sessions or develop units of work. Our teacher support co-ordinator is Sue Gardiner. She can be contacted on : seg@henry-cort.hants.sch.uk

Playground to podium

'Playground to Podium' is the new national strategy for the identification, development and support of talented young disabled athletes, developed by the Youth Sport Trust, Sport England, UK Sport and the British Paralympic Association.
