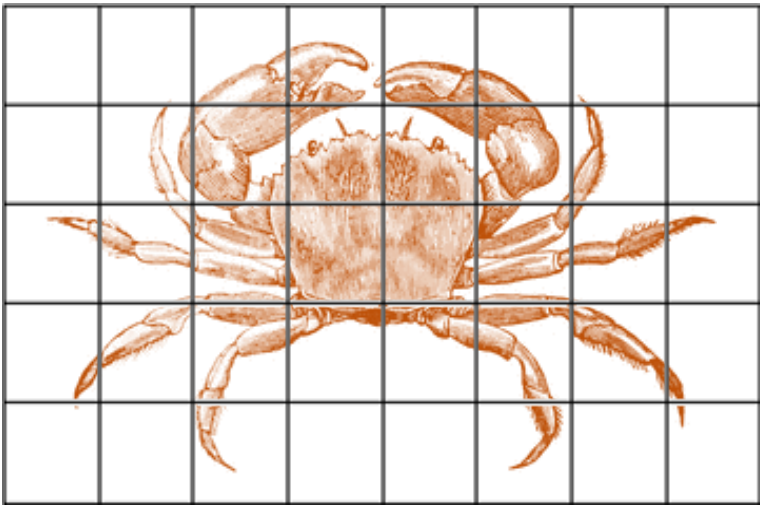

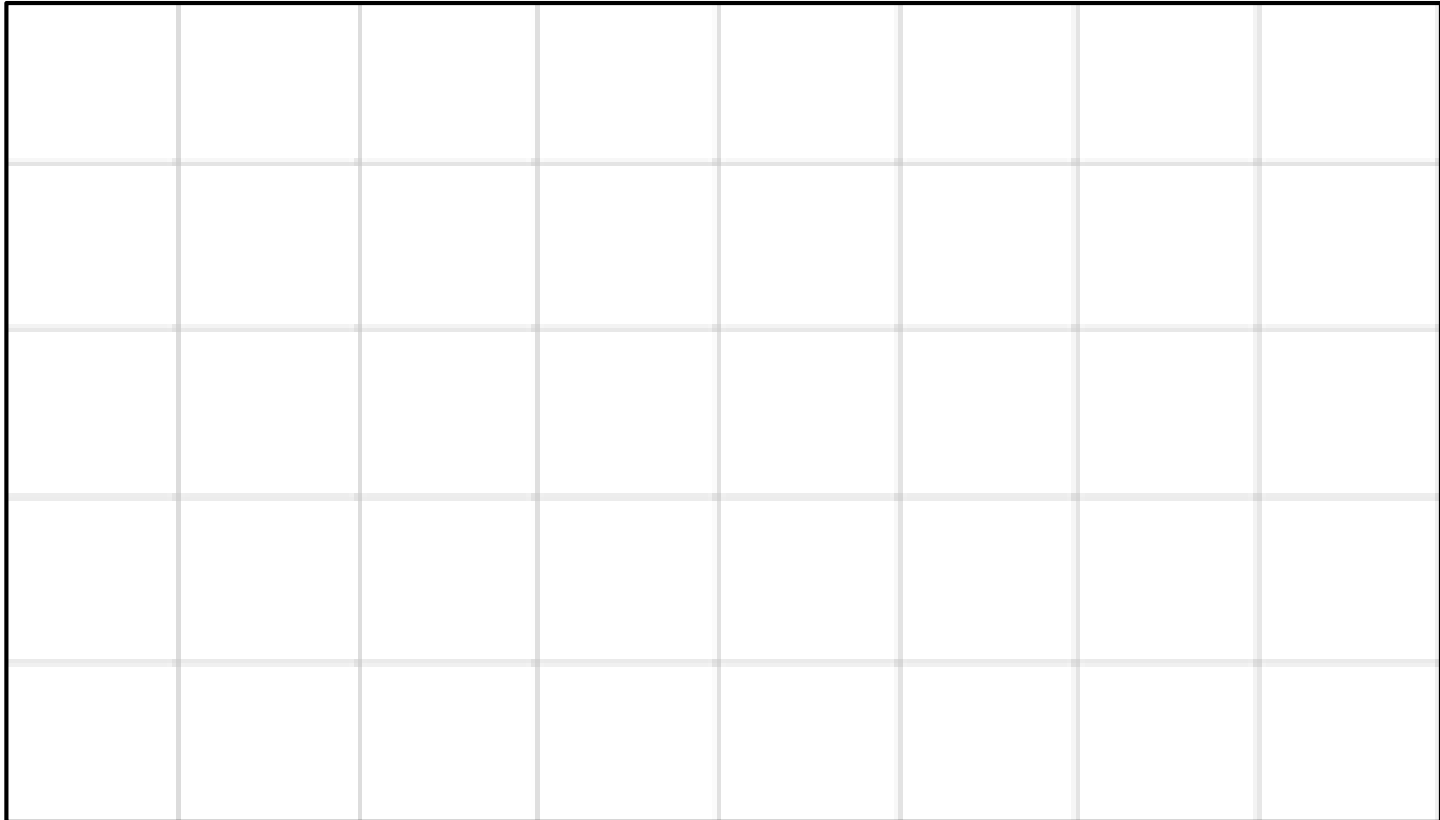

To Do:

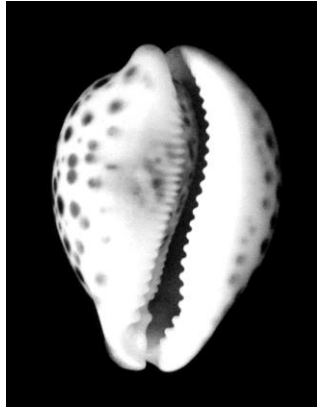
- Draft lightly with pencil allowing you to correct mistakes as you go

- Use a variety of marks when drawing textures and detail



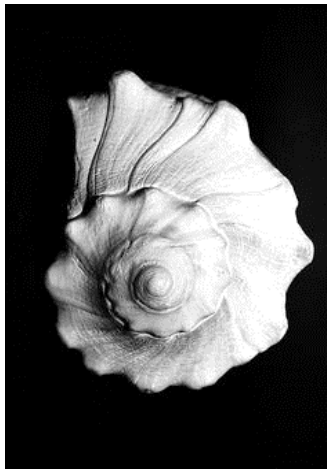


To Do:

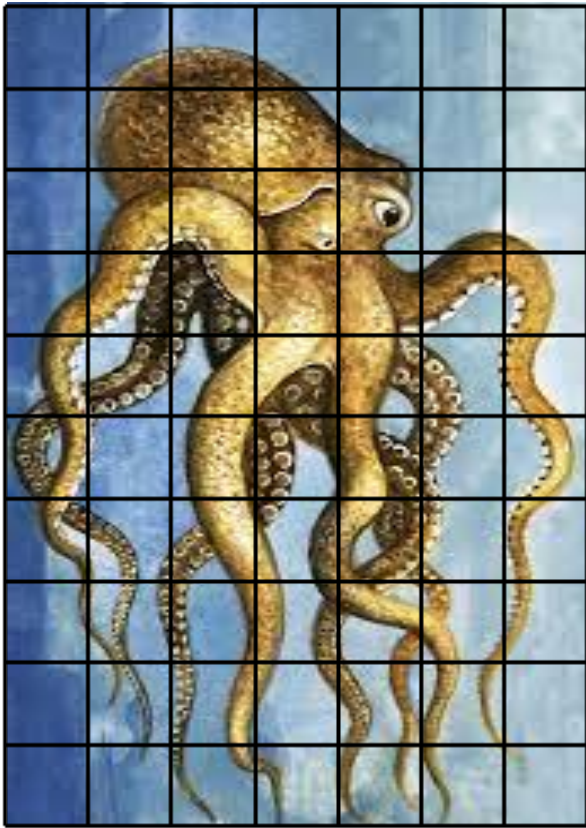
- Use your mobile phone to take a range of photographs which explore items found on the beach

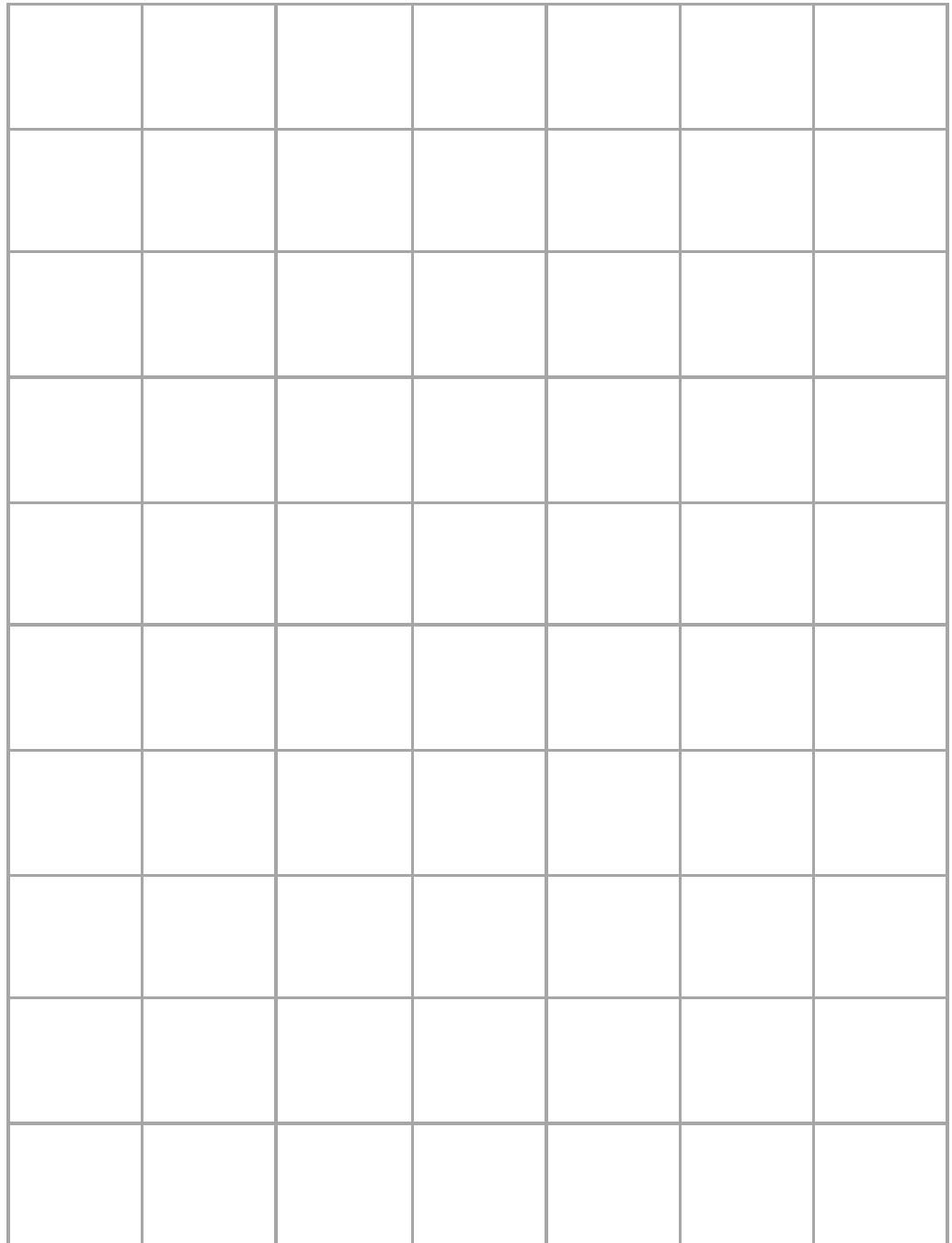

To Do:

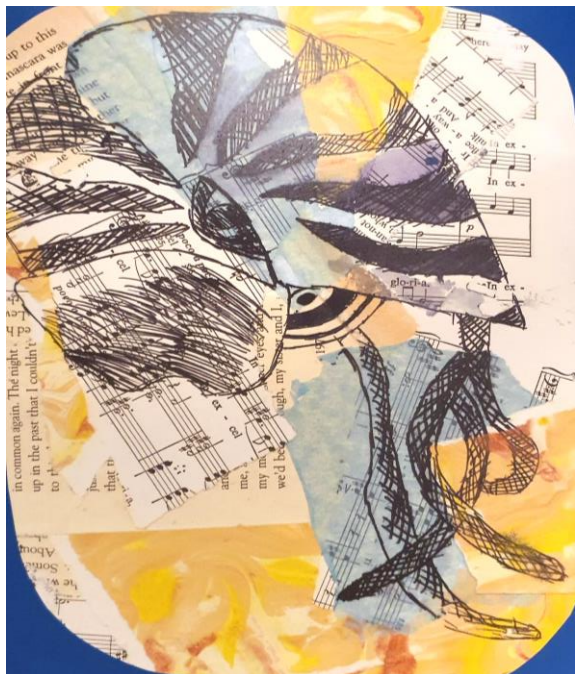
- Draft lightly with pencil allowing you to correct mistakes as you go
- Try to blend your colouring pencil, using different pressure to explore different shades of that colour
- Use a variety of marks when drawing textures and detail

To Do:

- Create your own piece of mixed media artwork based around a sea creature of choice



Tips:

- Layer at least 3 different types of paper within your background
- Draw your sea creature using black pen and at least 1 other media
- Incorporate different thicknesses of lines

- Create a sculpture from recycled plastics, which can be used to raise awareness for the problems our oceans encounter

- Items may include bottles, straws, carrier bags, bubble wrap and other packaging, disposable cutlery etc

- Apply appropriate colour and tone to suggest 3D qualities

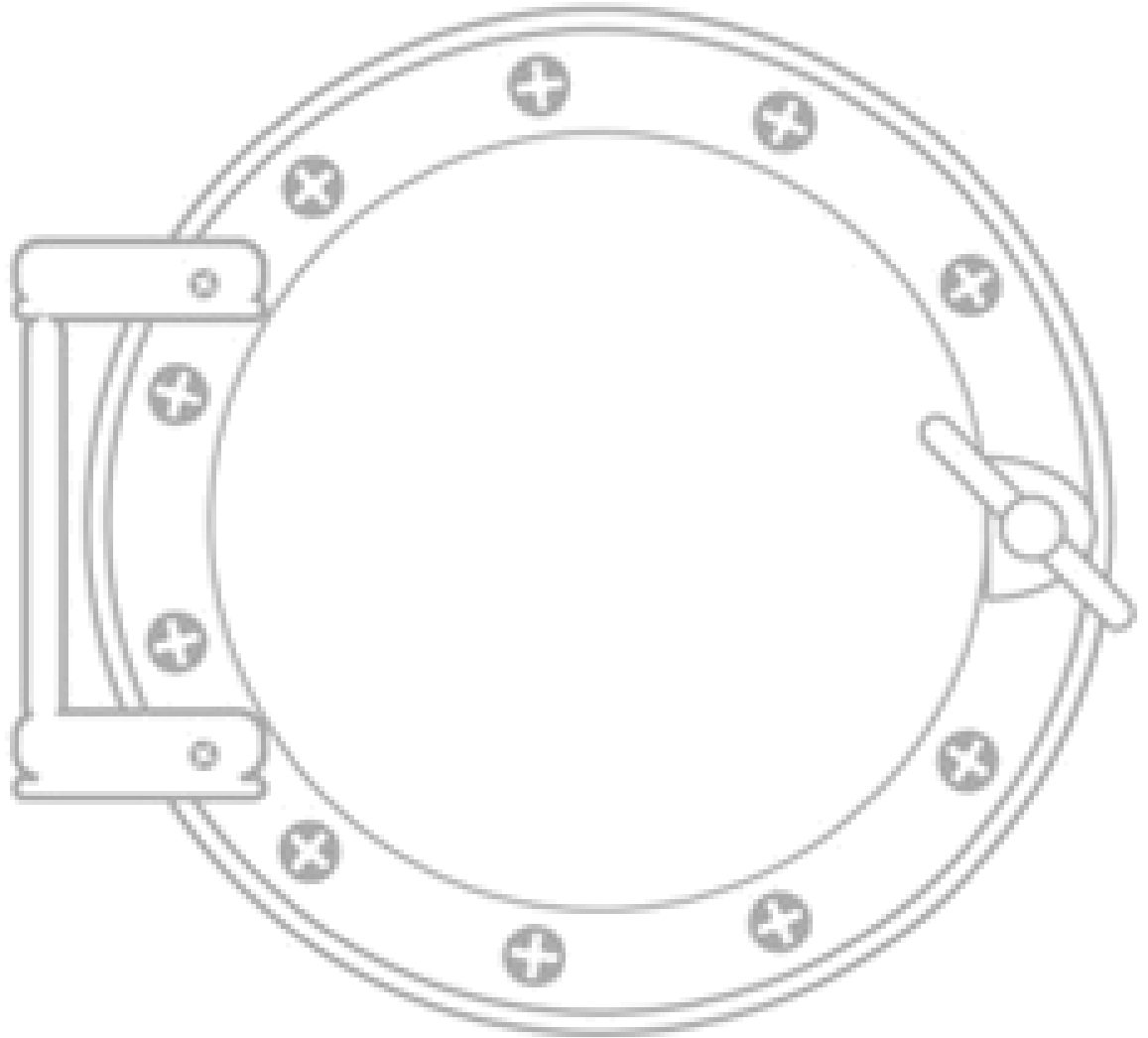
Through the porthole window
